# **First Presbyterian Church South Charleston, Ohio History**

In 1822, the Rev. William Dickey was assigned to spend eight days in missionary work in South Charleston. His evangelistic efforts produced a twelve-member Presbyterian “society.” The society grew in number and finally constructed our present building in 1902. In 1989, Bill Reisenweaver was ordained and installed as our pastor. We celebrated our 175<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 1997. Over the past 20 years, our church membership and our ministries have steadily expanded. We have gone from being a community church, only drawing people from our own local area, to being a regional church, drawing people from as far as 30 minutes away. In 2006 we dedicated a major building expansion, adding seven large classrooms and a large gathering area, doubling our space.

**STATEMENT OF CALL**  
**Katrina Pekich-Bundy**

I believe that everyone has a calling and that each of us has a purpose as members of the body of Christ. We are all called to use our talents and gifts in different ways to glorify God. No calling is better than another and everyone serves God in the world equally. The Reformed tradition embraces this in part because worship is a daily event that happens within each moment, including “in their work and in their play, in their thought and in their action, in their private and in their public relationships” (W-5.6002). We are drenched in the love of God and we are called to share that love with our neighbors.

I believe that Jesus Christ is my Savior and that I have been called to serve God and to work with others through ordained ministry. This was not an easy call to accept right away. It has taken time and exploration of my gifts and skills to test how God is calling me to respond. Growing up, I wanted to be a ballerina. I danced quite seriously throughout my youth and planned to go off to join a dance company. As I went through high school it became very clear that I enjoyed dance as a hobby - in my home congregation I was encouraged to share my love of dance as liturgical dance but it took me a while to recognize this was an affirmation of my call to more than merely dancing. At the time I had no clue where to go or what to do. Then, I began to hear a small voice. It was not exactly clear what the voice said but I did understand that it was leading me to something larger than myself. It was calling me to look beyond myself. Eventually I was able to articulate that it was leading me to seminary and I spoke with my pastor. He invited me to work in a summer internship at a church and to help my home congregation prepare their Summer Bible School Program. In addition, he invited me to co-lead a Synod Workshop. He suggested I go to a liberal arts college where I had many options that would help me discern my call.

I attended Alma College in Michigan and began seeking out clarity from this voice – the voice of what I believe is the Holy Spirit. The Discovering Vocations program at Alma really helped me to narrow in on my calling. I was encouraged by peers and mentors to pursue ministry as a full-time vocation. I believe that within the Reformed tradition it is important to listen to those around you, because a calling is not just from God, but also confirmed by those who see you daily and can truly see your gifts. My home congregation continues to encourage me and affirm my call to ordained ministry, welcoming me home to participate in worship leadership when I am in town.

While in college, I participated in mission trips and internships that opened my eyes to the world. I realized that tragedy, homelessness, and poverty did not just hit those in far away countries, but affected our neighbors in our own backyard. I began to feel called to working in an inner city church dealing with issues of social justice, including homelessness, poverty and women’s issues. With my own experiences in life I feel that I can offer an empathetic ear, listening to those in pain, and being able to help them know that God suffers with us and cries with us and that we are also resurrected with the hope of Jesus.

At this time I feel particularly called to ministries of social justice. I recognize that ministering to people who are in situations of poverty and homelessness is not limited to giving them food and money, because that would not solve the problem. It is also about sharing the good news of the Gospel and walking with others in their spiritual journey. Jesus himself was homeless and ate with people who were often the outcast of society. I feel that I am called to follow in his footsteps and share the grace of Jesus Christ as best I am able.

My current church placement has helped me to see that my calling for a social justice ministry can also be applied in a large church of people who are middle to upper class. They have a strong sense of reaching out to the community and working with the homeless. With our combined passions and ideas we have created a social justice ministry through the Salvation Army, inviting friends to the table where we can break bread together. This congregation has supported my call and also helped to challenge me in how I view ministry. They have helped me to see some of my other gifts and how I can use them as a minister of the word and sacrament.

The Administrative Commission for Dayton: Heritage has concluded its work as follows:

**Closing Worship Service**

The closing worship service was conducted on Sunday, February 15, 2009, with participation from many past members of Heritage and the incoming Immanuel Korean Presbyterian Church. The service was followed by a time of fellowship and remembrance. These events were very positively received by the participants.

**Pastoral Care**

Two members with health problems have been identified for continuing care. They will be contacted by the pastoral staff of Dayton: Southminster. No requests have been made for membership transfers to date.

**Records and Finances**

All church records and electronic data were collected and are now in the possession of the Stated Clerk. All debts have been settled and mission gifts were distributed. The presbytery is paying utilities until Immanuel Korean establishes the accounts in their name. The check has been received from the state regarding the sale of property. After all payments have been made for HPC, the net balance will be gifted to IKPC at the request of the HPC session.

**Reflections**

In retrospect, the AC believes that it would have been helpful to allow more time between the departure of the Heritage congregation from the building and the arrival of IKPC. This would have provided time for coordination between the Heritage AC and the IKPC AC, and allowed for a neater process in terms of tying up some loose ends regarding facility usage. Overall, this was a unique, positive experience in which we were able to celebrate the ministry of one congregation at the end of its life cycle, while rejoicing in the birth of a new ministry in the same location.

Final report

The commission met on October 30, 2008 in the presbytery office and received a brief history of the NCD for the formation of a Korean Presbyterian Church and the plan for moving the NCD permanently to Dayton Heritage building. On consensus, Elder Bill Artman was chosen as the commission Moderator and Rev. Ken Howard was chosen as clerk.

Heritage's session met on Nov 5, 2008 and requested the Presbytery form an administrative commission for the purpose of closing Heritage. This action was approved by presbytery at the Nov 8, 2008 meeting with a closing date of February 2009.

A Steering Committee was appointed on November 6, 2008 with the responsibility to work with Immanuel Korean Presbyterian Church to elect, and train elders, deacons and a clerk. Members of the committee were Elder Ann Peters (chair), Elder Kathy Ungerman (clerk of Session at Southminster), Jana Bobo (fluent in Korean), Young Foster (fluent in Korean) along with Man Pyo Han, Oh Sang Ro, and Jung Ho Choi from the Korean congregation.

On December 2, 2008, the commission adopted proposed by-laws and Articles of Incorporation. The presbytery approved the articles of incorporation on February 14, 2009. Arrangements were made with the Office of the General Assembly to provide Korean translations of both documents. The Articles of Incorporation were sent to the State of Ohio.

The Steering Committee reviewed the attendance and identified 33 adult charter members plus Rev Soo Kwang Kim and 7 children. One charter member has not been baptized and will join by profession of faith. The rest will join on reaffirmation of faith. At least two more potential members are receiving instruction and preparation for baptism and profession of faith.

On April 19, 2009, the Administrative Commission met, approved the order of worship, and agreed to proceed to installation. Rev Dr. Soo Kwang Kim was installed as Pastor of Immanuel Korean Presbyterian Church. Elders elect Man Pyo Han and Oh Sang Ro were ordained and installed and Deacon elect Jung Ho Choi was ordained and installed. Kwonsa elects Young Ja Vaughn, Jung Hee Kim and Kee Nam Kim were installed.

We recommend that the Presbytery of the Miami Valley accept this final report and the Administrative Commission be dismissed with the presbytery's thanks.
